## Dear Parents / Guardians,

As we return to school after the fall break for students, we are seeing a surge in local Co-Vid cases in our community. Our main priority continues to be the safety of all students, staff and families and keeping our students in school. We want to be sure that we do not become complacent in our protocols at this time so we will be emphasizing with all students and families in the coming weeks:

- Daily use of the Co-Vid screening tool prior to attending school and an understanding of the different measures
  that need to be taken depending on any symptoms. Please see the following links for updated information from

- Continued focus on consistent hand washing and/or hand sanitization
- Continued mask use inside the school with appropriate breaks during eating or silent activities. Our students
  have demonstrated they can do this effectively.
- Mask use on the busses
- Outside masks may be taken off when students are able to social distance. We want students to understand their responsibility to each other in this regard and will be emphasizing this next week
- After School students are asked to leave the school grounds to be picked up or to walk home immediately upon dismissal. The school playground will not be open before or after school. If a student is waiting for a ride, they are asked to wait in a socially distanced manner or to wear masks when with others.

As gym class moves inside, we will ensure that our classes have a dedicated space and daily activity. Activities
will be designed to provide as much social distancing as possible and students may be required to wear masks
during certain low impact activities where distancing is not possible

We will continue to emphasize the importance of a school community approach to taking care of each other. We have seen the impact of a quarantine situation on classes of students and staff at other buildings. Our goal is to avoid these situations for our students and staff and keep families safe.
