Request from parent: Continued emphasis on academic awards going forward and making students aware of what awards are available

Request from parent: same emphasis on academics as athletics and arts, providing incentive

Top academic award has been added

Continuum: from no academic awards or awards to more, Paterson seems to be at the pinnacle of awards available.

Award ceremony is happening during the day so that kids are aware of what awards available.

Awards are not always emphasized because there is a continuum of abilities within the school.

- **6.** Trustees Report Tyler Demers
 - a. Superintendent search: will be announced later this week (hopefully)
 - b. Westside elementary: construction contract was awarded to Ward Brothers, construction to start this summer, playgrounds are done as part of the initial project and done as a cost-share with the city, Christine Lee works with new principal, get kids involved and companies involved, will be 2 storey and have an elevator
 - c. Victoria Park upgrade-will be completed in three different phases
 - d. Galbraith modernization—planning funds were approved by the provincial government. Will be used to plan a study
 - e. Transportation-2.4 km to 1 km—has to be implemented by September 2024. Will remain at 2.4 km until 2024. Will be 1/3 more buses for 2024. Question: is charging for busing on the table? Not at this time. If there is room on the bus and there is room on the bus, they may be able to take the bus but will be bumped if there is a need.
 - f. Southern Alberta Collegiate Institute-collaboration with neighbouring districts, dedicated education space for secondary students at Lethbridge College to teach trades, agriculture, medical. Some courses will be dual credit—college course credit and high school credit. Each division will have a number of seats available. Will be blocks of course offerings. 10 students from Lethbridge school division are currently in the Career Pathways program.
 - g. Spanish Bilingual program—will be at GS Lakie for students who were in the Coalbanks program, bussing will not be available
 - h. Community Conversation—will likely in be mid-June
