#### Counselling updates - October's Mental Health Minute from the Wellness Team

Stress and anxiety are a normal part of life. As the school year falls into a rhythm, students may feel increased stress with time management struggles, preparing for tests or quizzes, and demands within a fast-paced school environment. Intense emotions are often a part of the middle school experience and helping your child learn skills to handle the ups and downs will lead to positive coping throughout life. How to manage stress is a skill that is not innate and needs to be taught, just like long division or essay writing skills.
