- 8. Trustee Report-Andrea Andreachuck- Christine Lee reported about new school on the Westside in Garry Station. First 2 storey school since Senator Buchanan opened. Will have about 600 students when open but can accommodate 900 students. Working on realigning boundaries. Can contribute to naming school by February 15. Board went on a field trip to see the e-sports. Will be honouring new walking distances for buses. Discussed boost money for Grades 1-3 literacy and math—only received half the amount as was received last year. Superintendent Mike Nightingale: new curriculum, SIBA training happened, use of nutrition grant is high this year, early years assessment was completed. Healthy school choices changes to procedure from policy. Andrea A. went to Medicine Hat to look at play and learn program. Children with kindergarten teacher in the morning and half in early ed and then switch. School division looking to pilot in 1-3 schools due to fewer kindergarten registrations, could look at all day option. Community conversations: January 16 at Frank's Redwood Specialty Waffle Café, 418 13 st. N. from 1-2pm. Andrea and Robbie loved attending concert and did a site visit at Paterson. Question about busing: how will it work for families who have children in Grade 6 and older grades. Siblings would not be able to be on the bus unless there was room. Paterson currently has 401 students who ride the bus. Will be a registration process for the bus.
