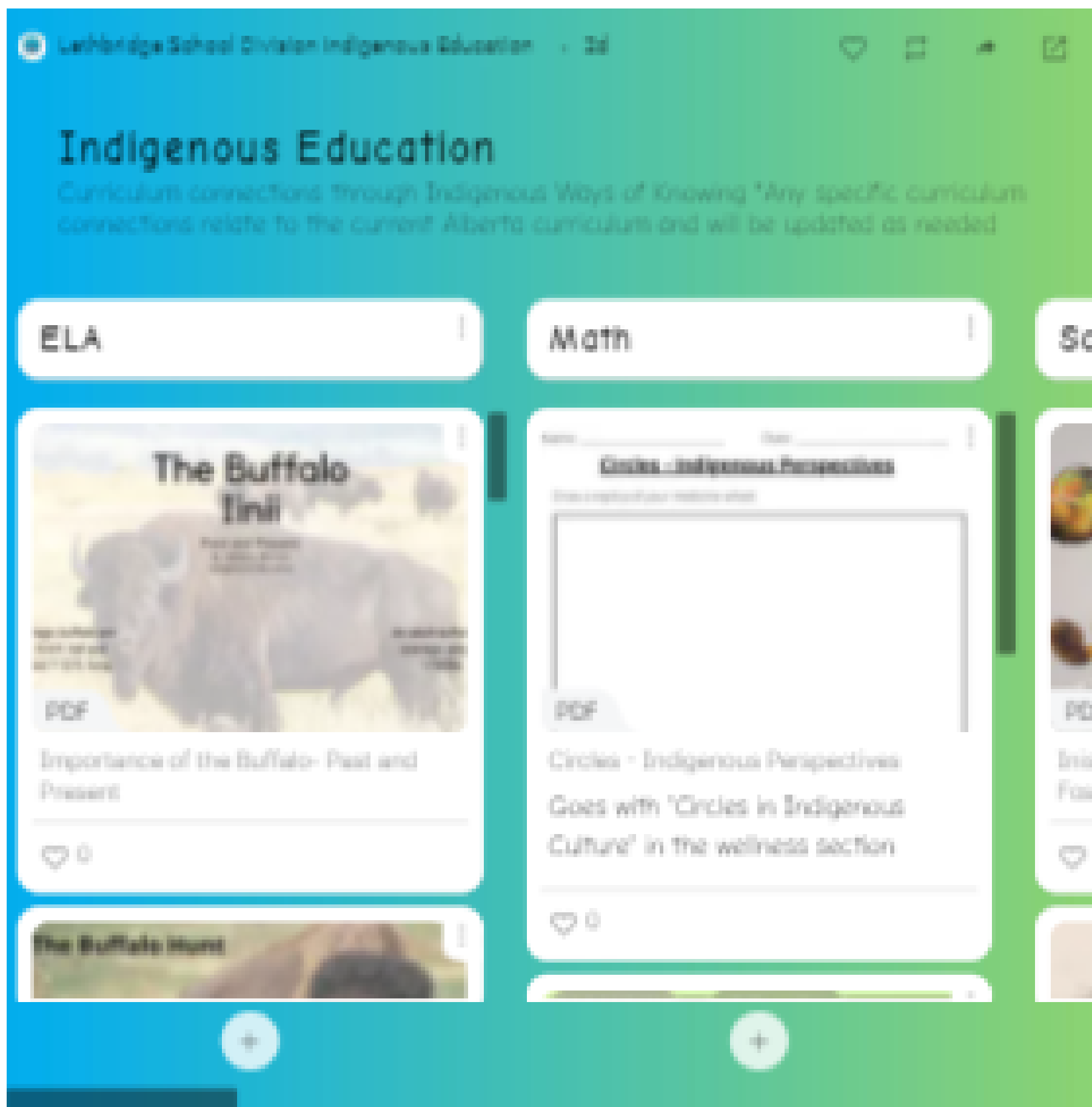

- The Moose Hide Campaign is a grassroots movement of Indigenous and non-Indigenous men and boys standing up to end violence towards women and children.
- A free, engaging, and inspiring developmentally appropriate K-12 content in a one-hour livestream on May 12th, 2022. On the day, you can expect: Ceremony, Cultural performances by Indigenous artists, TikTok influencer, Theland Kicknosway as our Youth Keynote speaker and Words from our co-founders.
- The livestream is on Thursday, May 12 from 11:30AM - 12:30PM. Links to workshops and the livestream will be sent out by your Indigenous Education teacher in advance.
- One of the main initiatives of the movement is the annual Moose Hide Campaign Day, which brings Canadians from coast to coast together to make tangible progress on reconciliation and the creation of a country free of violence against all.
- Your Indigenous Education team has already registered your schools for the live stream and ordered moose hide pins!

- Moose Hide pins will be sent out to all schools for every student and staff member. Everyone is encouraged to wear their Moose Hide pin on May 12th (and every day!) as a sign of commitment to honour, respect, and protect the women and children in your life.

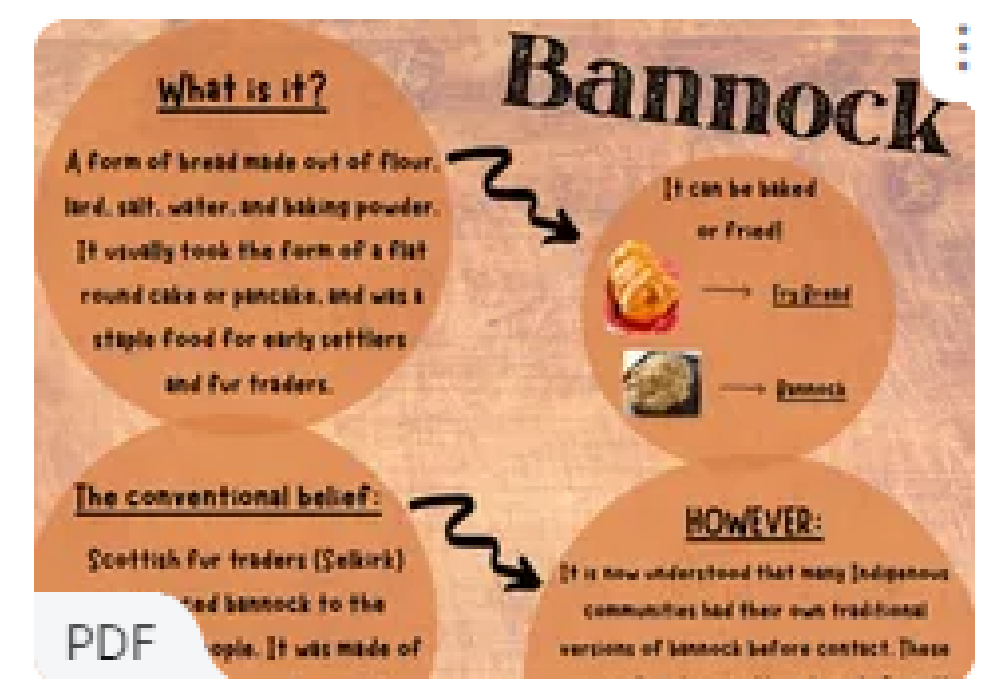
