## 9. Art in Schools-April Matisz

- a. Program of study-curriculum
- b. Grade 1-6 it is mandatory but middle school it's an option
- c. Students haven't been able to get into art classes
- d. Curriculum is from 1986 and is quite good
- e. Teachers feel unsure about teaching art
- f. April has spoken with Director of Learning and discussed working groups to help support teachers
- g. Seems to be more demand for arts than seats
- h. No art specialist teacher at GPMS
- i. April feels like there would be benefit to having an art specialist in a middle school
- j. Did not post an art specialist teacher in an effort to keep home room class sizes smaller than 35. Will offer 6 blocks of art for grade 6 next year. Over 150 students interested in art, foods, construction, sewing.
- k. Encourage teachers and principals to look at curriculum and program of studies
- I. Arts Alive and Well-may be a place to connect for students and teachers
- m. April would be happy to volunteer to help support students to get their work in the show
