



The DELF (Diplôme d'Études en Langue Française) is a globally recognized official certification that assesses one's proficiency in French. It offers various levels, from beginner (A1) to advanced (C2). For children, obtaining the DELF is a valuable achievement that not only boosts their confidence and motivation to learn, but also opens up new educational opportunities both in school and beyond. The DELF enhances critical skills such as thinking, communication, and cultural understanding. In today's globalized world, proficiency in French—and holding this official certificate—can provide children with a significant advantage across various fields.

The French Language Centre at the University of Lethbridge is an accredited testing center for French language proficiency. This initiative is supported by federal funding through the Official Languages in Education Protocol (OLEP), and diplomas are awarded by the French Ministry of National Education. The registration fee at the University of Lethbridge is \$30.

Please note, we will be accepting only 70 candidates, and registration will be handled on a first-come, first-served basis.
