- **Grade 6 PAT Information:** Alberta Education has provided important information regarding the 2024/25 Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs).

Grade 6 PATs in English Language Arts and Literature (ELAL) and Mathematics will not be administered in May and June 2025. Grade 6 PATs in social studies and science will continue as planned.

As you are aware, this school year saw mandatory implementation of the new curriculum in ELAL and Mathematics for Grade 6. In response to feedback received from school authorities, Grade 6 PATs in ELAL and Mathematics will not be administered this spring.

In their place, Alberta Education will be **field testing** newly developed assessments in these subjects. Field testing will take place between April and June 2025. The process of field testing determines the validity and reliability of questions that are in the development phase. For this reason, field testing results are not reported publicly; however, teachers will have the opportunity to score their field tests locally so they can gain some insight into student growth and achievement.

If your child's class will be participating in Grade 6 PAT field testing, the classroom teacher will communicate with you once dates and times are confirmed.

This month and early next month, Ms. Oviatt has been visiting classes to share a couple of strategies related to managing stress, preparing for tests, and using study strategies. Here are some of the "top 5" for these topics.

#### **Healthy Coping Strategies for Managing Stress**

- 1. Take care of your physical self get enough sleep, eat well, drink water
- 2. Plan ahead
- 3. Stretch/ Be active/ Go outside

- 4. Journal, laugh, or listen to music
- 5. Turn to people in your support circle


# **Preparing for the Test**

- 1. If your teacher gives you a study guide, complete it.
- 2. Use the terms on the study guide to create your flashcards. Try an app like **Quizlet** (some pre-made sets are available).
- 3. Have someone verbally quiz you using the questions from the study guide. Or, create your own questions that someone can ask you.
- 4. Review concepts frequently, then extend the time between your study sessions. This uses the concept, "psychological spacing effect", which helps to put the information in your long-term memory.
- 5. Practice a variety of test questions: multiple choice, matching, T/F, and short answer. Try an app like **Know** (uses AI to generate questions).

## **Study Strategies**

- 1. Make flashcards. Use colour and pictures and/or diagrams or try an app like Quizlet. The brain likes visual cues (called "dual coding").
- 2. Create a graphic organizer. It helps to summarize all you have learned.
- 3. Make your own study guide with 5-10 main questions from each unit. Ask a friend to do the same and switch study guides. Then, give them back to each other and "mark" them.
- 4. SQ3R is a set of steps for reading over notes or your textbook: survey, question, read, recite, and review. (Google "SQ3R" for more information.)
- 5. Decide how you study best. Music or no music? Breaks after 20 or 30 minutes? A snack before or after you study? Make studying a habit.

## **Writing the Test**

- 1. Look over the entire test when you first get it. Do the questions you know first this helps build confidence!
- 2. You do not need to go in order of the questions but remember to check over the test when you are done.
- 3. Highlight key words in the question.
- 4. Cross off answers from the choices (multiple choice) that you KNOW are not the right choice.
- 5. Use estimating to check your answers when you can (especially with Math and some Science questions).
