- Grade 6 PAT Information
  - NEW Grade 6 Science, Grade 6 French Immersion Language Arts and Literature (FILAL) and Grade 6 Français Langue Première et Littérature (FLPL) will not be administered in the 2024/25 school year. Alberta Education will instead offer field testing between April and June 2025. These optional field tests will help inform the development of future PATs for these Grade 6 subjects that align with new curriculum.

Please note that there will be only 2 locations this year: west and north. If you have families requiring assistance with transportation, please let them know that upon registration they can request bus tickets to attend. Things to note about this year's event:

   Mindfulness A strategy for managing June changes and stress

At this stage in the year, you may notice your child's behaviour shift. In situations they may normally have handled with ease, they might become increasingly emotional or appear not to have the skills to problem solve. With field trips, final exams, and sometimes uncertainty around summer plans, the usual routines and patterns are different from the rest of the school year. Changes in patterns can sometimes result in dysregulation in teens (difficulty regulating moods and/or reactions).

Mindfulness can be a powerful tool to help teens develop better self-regulation. Research shows that mindfulness practices—such as deep breathing, body awareness, and guided meditation—can strengthen attention and reduce emotional reactivity in adolescents. For example, a study published in the Journal of

Adolescence found that mindfulness training led to improvements in teens' ability to focus and manage their emotions more effectively (Dumontheil et al., 2023). These benefits are especially helpful during adolescence, a time marked by emotional ups and downs and increased stress.

Mindfulness also encourages teens to pause and reflect before reacting, supporting healthier communication and decision-making. By incorporating mindfulness into daily routines—whether through apps or simple breathing exercises—you can give your middle schooler a practical and science-backed way to navigate emotions and build resilience, especially during times of change at this point in the school year.
